





## “State of Water Conservation”

### ***“NORMAL CONDITION”***

Based on current water conditions the Board of Water Commissioners are pleased to report that water levels are “Normal” at this time. Based on the Districts Drought Management Plan both ground water levels and precipitation is at or above normal.

Normal ground water conditions which we currently experiencing means there is no need for any actions from the public. However, over time ground water levels do change and the District will be monitoring and make adjustments in the water condition status if needed.

Customers are reminded that good habits and water conservation practices at all times no matter the conditions should be followed. If for no other reason it could save you money. Less use and less water to heat result in lower water and energy costs.
