In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Dennis Water District, qualified to vote in District affairs, to meet at the

ARTICLE 1. ANNUAL REPORTS

To hear and act on the Reports of the District Officers for the Calendar and Fiscal Year 2023.

By the Board of Water Commissioners.

Finance Committee recommendation to be at the District Meeting.

ARTICLE 2. ELECTED OFFICIALS' SALARIES

To see if the District will vote to fix the salary and compensation of the following elected officers of the District for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2024 and to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds a sum of money therefore:

3 Water Commissioners at \$2,550 each; 1 Moderator at \$306

By the Board of Water Commissioners.

Finance Committee recommends the transfer of \$7,956 from Water Revenues of the Fiscal Year 2025 for the purpose of the article.

ARTICLE 3. OPERATING & MAINTENANCE BUDGET

To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer and appropriate, take from available funds in the Treasury, or otherwise, a sum of money for the Operating and Maintenance Expenses for the Fiscal Year 2025 or take any action relative thereto.

By the Board of Water Commissioners to transfer and appropriate \$5,636,600 from Water Revenues of the Fiscal Year 2025 for the purpose of the article.

Finance Committee recommends \$5,636,600 from the FY 2025 Water Revenues for the purpose of the article.

ARTICLE 4. CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS

To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer and appropriate, take from available funds in the Treasury, or borrow, a sum of money for Capital Appropriations as follows:

ARTICLE 5. LAND ACQUISITION—OFF FLAX POND

To see if the District will vote to authorize the Board of Water Commissioners to acquire by gift, purchase or eminent domain, for watershed conservation protection and pursuant to G. L. c. 40, §3A, the fee interest in two parcels of real property described as follows:

- 1) 0 Near Flax Pond, a parcel of land located in the Town of Dennis, County of Barnstable, Massachusetts, containing approximately 6.0+/- acres, shown as Town of Assessors Map Parcel 225-93.
- 2) 0 Madison Road, a parcel of land located in the Town of Dennis, County of Barnstable, Massachusetts, containing approximately .160 +/- acres, shown as Town of Assessors Map Parcel 225-103

The combined parcels are shown on a plan entitled "PLAN OF LAND AT FLAX POND, DENNIS, MA, PREPARED FOR DENNIS WATER DISTRICT, SCALE 1" = 60', FEBRUARY 28, 2024, DEMAREST LAND SURVEYING, 338 MAYFAIR ROAD, SOUTH DENNIS, MA 02660" said property to be under the care, custody, management and control of the Board of Water Commissioners; and to determine whether this appropriation shall be raised by borrowing or otherwise; to authorize the Board of Water Commissioners to file on behalf of the District any and all applications deemed necessary for grants and reimbursements from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under G.L. c. 40, § 39B and 41, or any other application for funds and to contract for, accept and expend any such grants, provided, however, that the authorized amount of the borrowing under this vote shall be reduced by the amount of any grants or aid received at the time of such borrowing; and further, to authorize the Board of Water Commissioners to enter into all agreements and execute any and all instruments as may be necessary or convenient on behalf of the District to effect said acquisition, or to take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 6. WATER PRESSURE FILTER REHABILITATION

To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer and appropriate, take from available funds in the Treasury, or borrow, the sum of \$1,673,800 for Water Pressure Filter Rehabilitation, or to take any other action relative thereto.

By the Board of Water Commissioners to transfer and appropriate \$535,005 from the Green Sand Replacement Account and to borrow \$1,138,795 for the purpose of the article.

Finance Committee recommends to transfer and appropriate \$535,005 from the Green Sand Replacement Account and to borrow \$1,138,795 for the purpose of the article
